Clarkson University Achievement Award

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who demonstrates leadership and outstanding academic achievement. This award automatically carries a \$48,000 (\$12,000 per year) tuition scholarship if the recipient chooses to enroll at Clarkson University.

Clarkson University Leadership Award

Claire Zwack

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who demonstrates outstanding leadership qualities and is recognized by faculty and students as having been a positive contributor to the school and community. This award automatically carries a \$60,000 (\$15,000 per year) tuition scholarship if the recipient chooses to enroll at Clarkson University.

Elmira College Key

Kristin Kolmetz, Maison Ross

The Elmira Key is given based on academic merit and outstanding school and community leadership. Recipients of the Elmira Key receive a scholarship of \$60,000 (\$15,000 per year) upon enrolling at Elmira College.

Horohoe-Turner Art Scholarship

Ruth recently died and my mom would like to offer this scholarship in honor of her friend who changed my mother's life for the better. This scholarship is in the amount of \$1,000.

Lawrence Technological University Award for Excellence in Science & Mathematics

Rachel Carson Book Award

Chatham University offers the Rachel Carson Book Award for junior students who have shown passion for the environment and interest in writing or the sciences. This junior is receiving a copy of the Silent Spring book as well as a \$1,000 scholarship to Chatham University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, should they choose to attend.
